


Trustees	Julia Griffiths Chair - remit Education Governance and Child Protection (DSP)

She has had a long association with the School, working as a Kindergarten Assistant from its first year, and then as Parent and Toddler leader. She completed half of the Steiner class teacher training in Machynlleth before the course closed. In her working life she was active in the Playgroup Movement, instigating two playgroups in Ilford and Cardiff. She taught in Nursery and Infant schools and became a Nursery Inspector. She lectured in 'Early Years Education' at Coleg Glan Hafren for ten years, until she retired in 1998. Her husband, Teifion, was headmaster of St Teilo's Church In Wales High School, Cardiff for sixteen years. He is a former Director and Trustee of Camphill Glasallt Fawr in Mid Wales, a Steiner residential community for young people with special needs, where his and Julia's youngest daughter lived for seven years. Shireen Griffiths Trustee– remit for Regulation and Compliance, and HR Committee
