Cardiff Steiner School is looking for a part-time Spanish teacher to bring an imaginative and enlivened experience of Spanish language and culture to our children age 6 to 10.

For the first three years children are taught orally only, in ways that immerse the children in language and make language learning fun. Lessons are filled with age-appropriate, seasonal poetry, songs, tongue twisters and verses, often involving actions and finger games. As they progress children learn and act-out dramatised stories and short plays, and begin to take a more active part orally. This builds a foundation of experiences for reading and writing from the end of Class 3 (Year 4).

Job Description Spanish Teacher

Responsible to: The position reports to and is supported in day-to-day matters by the College of Teachers and Lower School Education Coordinator, and is accountable to the Board of Trustees.

The primary focus of the post is to hold responsibility for Spanish language teaching and activity from age 6 to 11 within the school, and to bring a strong and enlivened Spanish language experience to pupils within the context of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum.

Full time salary £23,958 – 14.81% Pro Rata post (actual salary £3,549). 5 hours per week (4 x 45 min lessons, plus planning, prep, meeting and professional development time). We have a 36 week teaching year.

Your duties will include:

1. To teach Spanish to our children aged between 6 and 10 years.
2. To use the Steiner Waldorf Language curriculum to devise and deliver a developmentally appropriate Spanish language programme that conforms to the principles and methods of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum for this age group. (We have teachers experienced and able to offer advice and support in working with the Steiner Waldorf curriculum, and a Spanish Teacher for our older classes who can offer opportunities for mentoring and observation both at Cardiff and other Steiner schools.)
3. To prepare, plan and assess your teaching to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum for both individuals and classes, in accordance with statutory and school requirements
4. To assess the pupils and keep records for both individuals and classes, in accordance with statutory and school requirements
5. To maintain good discipline so that learning can take place in the class and so that the provisions of the school's health and safety policy are met
6. To liaise with colleagues and parents
7. To organise materials for class use and liaise with those responsible for purchase, keeping within an agreed budget
8. To support the school's ethos, principles and objectives
9. To undertake study and training as necessary for the effective delivery of the curriculum
10. To be aware of, operate within and implement the school's policies and procedures, with particular reference to those aimed at safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children
11. To take part in the appraisal of your own work performance
12. To attend teacher/staff meetings, or observation and mentoring as required
13. To attend INSET days, Parents Evenings and other duties outside the normal school day
15. To provide break supervision and cover for colleagues, as required within your contracted hours
14. Any other duties reasonably requested by the school. The job description is current but liable to variation to reflect or anticipate changes in the requirements of the post.
