Job Description Wraparound Care Session Leader

Responsible to/for: The position is accountable through the College to the Board of Trustees. The position works in collaboration with the Early Years Faculty and with the advice and support of the Wraparound Care Supervisors and Compliance Group. The position is responsible for directing and guiding the Assistant working with them in the setting during the session.

Duties:

- 1. To run the Wraparound Care sessions and maintain the environment and rhythm of the session.
- 2. To be responsible during these sessions for compliance with CIW regulations and the National Minimum Standards for Regulated Childcare for children up to the age of 12 years.
- 3. To learn about the principles of Steiner Waldorf Education and to ensure the service works within them.
- 4. To work with the children to support creative play, artistic and domestic activities and creative discipline, and be actively engaged with the content of the session.
- 5. To attend to the individual needs of the children including taking children to the toilet, helping with washing hands, getting dressed for outside play etc.
- 6. To supervise the children in the garden or on walks.
- 7. To take care of children needing comfort or first aid.
- 8. To be responsible for safeguarding, and promoting the welfare, of the children in your care, and be alert and aware of situations needing attention, and to respond appropriately.
- 9. To prepare, supervise and clear away the room, activities, materials and snack
- 10. To clean and mend equipment, and help maintain areas used, including the main room, cloakroom, kitchen and garden.
- 11. To attend meetings as required.
- 12. To take part in the appraisal of your own work performance.
- 13. To support the School's ethos, principles and objectives.
- 14. To be aware of and operate within the school's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including the Equal Opportunities and Health and Safety policies.
- 15. Any other duties reasonably requested by the School.

- QCF Level 3 Diploma in Children's Care, Learning and Development, or Playwork, or equivalent qualification as required under the List of required qualifications to work within early years and childcare sector in Wales. Please check that your qualification is accepted.
- 2 years' experience in a childcare or similar setting
- An ability to lead the session Proven experience of working with children in a relevant setting
- Good working knowledge, or the ability to develop a good working knowledge, of CIW regulations and the National Minimum Standards for Regulated Childcare for children up to the age of 12 years
- An ability to lead sessional childcare and to direct and Assistant under your guidance
- To be a role model worthy of imitation by the children in your care
- An understanding and commitment to the importance of play in childhood
- An ability to relate to and nurture children
- An interest in and enthusiasm to learn about Steiner Waldorf Education
- · Personal warmth, patience, respect, empathy and understanding
- A flexible, positive approach to work and ability to work under pressure
- Excellent organisational skills and a strong sense of responsibility
- Experience or good working knowledge of record keeping in a childcare setting
- Excellent communication skills with staff, parents and carers, and an ability to work in a small, close knit team
