With a further two Schools planning to open their Upper School in 2019 and 2020 with the NZCSE, it will be the most widely offered qualification in UK Steiner Schools that offer a full K-Class 12 Steiner Waldorf education.

Job Description Class Teacher

Responsible to: The position is part of the Lower School Faculty, a team of 3/4 Class Teachers carrying responsibility for the Lower School, plus Subject Teachers, Learning Support Team and Assistants. The Faculty work with the leadership and support of the Lower School Education Coordinator and Teaching Development Group. The position is accountable through the College to the Board of Trustees.

The Class Teacher is responsible for one class of children between the ages of 6 and 14 years and under normal circumstances is expected to take responsibility for the Class through from Class 1 (age 6-7) to the end of Class 8 (age -13-14). The Class Teacher has overall responsibility both for the pastoral care of the Class and for much of the classroom work, supported in this by the Lower School Faculty.

Duties:

- 1. To bring a secure understanding of the Steiner curriculum, teaching method and the pedagogical principles that underpin them, and to renew this understanding through further study, on-going reflection and discussion of classroom practice.
- 2. To nurture the healthy development of the children's physical, social, emotional and cognitive skills, in a way which is appropriate to their age, and which enables all pupils to recognise and achieve their potential.

3. To teach:

- The Main Lesson, and additional lessons to your Class
- Subject Lessons to other Classes as appropriate to your skills
- Accompany the class in Subject Lessons with other teachers where necessary
- 4. To take overall responsibility for the class including:
 - Maintaining good discipline and creating a harmonious learning environment where pupils feel safe, happy and can learn effectively;
 - Ensuring good work and study habits are developed;
 - Ensuring the curriculum is appropriate for all pupils with effective differentiation;
 - Implementing effective assessment and recording systems to identify pupils' progress and learning needs, and use this support teaching and planning, in accordance with School requirements;
 - Keeping appropriate records, plans and pupil files, in accordance with statutory and School requirements
 - Liaising with parents at regular whole class parents' evenings, individual consultation sessions, including home visits where required, and to provide further opportunities for parents to understand the School's priorities and ethos;
 - Organising and supervising the Class's participation in trips, festivals and other activities;
 - Managing the classroom environment and maintaining it to a high standard of cleanliness and aesthetics;
 - Organising materials for Class use and liaising with those responsible for purchase, keeping within an agreed budget;
 - Participating in the admissions process for new pupils;
 - Liaising with Subject Teachers and other colleagues to develop a coordinated approach to curriculum and individualised learning;

- Liaising with other agencies and professionals where necessary; and working effectively with support staff, Management Group and the Administrative Team.
- 5. To review and reflect on your own teaching practice and take part in the appraisal of your own work performance and assist in the appraisal of colleagues.
- 6. To attend Teachers' meetings and other meetings as required.
- 7. To participate in providing cover for break time and cover for absent colleagues.
- 8. To support the School's ethos, principles and objectives, and actively contribute to whole-school activities and development.
- 9. To undertake appropriate preparation, study and training as necessary both for the effective delivery of the curriculum and to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives; including participating in work, study and Inset days during school holidays or weekends as required.
- 10. To develop an understanding of, and work within, the School's compliance and legal obligations, including Estyn.
- 11. To be aware of and operate within the school's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including the Equal Opportunities and Health and Safety policies.
- 12. Uphold the School's commitment to safeguarding children and young people.
- 13. Any other duties reasonably requested by the school. The job description is current but liable to variation to reflect or anticipate changes in the requirements of the post.

Essential

- An approved Steiner Waldorf Teaching Qualification;
- A committed individual with a deep interest in Steiner-Waldorf education who supports the School's ethos and approach to education
- A calm, positive and authoritative manner;
- A genuine love for teaching and working with children this age, and an ability to relate to and inspire them;
- An ability to maintain good discipline and behaviour with a consistent, firm but caring approach;
- An ability to communicate and cooperate well with colleagues and parents;
- An ability to work in a small, close knit team and willingness to work with colleagues in the continued development of the school and the curriculum;
- An appreciation and enjoyment of rising to the challenge of developing a young school;
- Self-motivation and imagination;
- Strong organisational skills and a strong sense of responsibility;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills;
- A flexible, positive approach to work and ability to work under pressure;
- A sense of humour;
- A track record of being punctual and reliable
- Suitability to work with children and a satisfactory enhanced Disclosure Barring Service check;
- Candidates from abroad will be asked to provide criminal records clearance from countries of residence, as well as evidence of eligibility to work in the UK. Candidates must have the right to work in the UK prior to application.
