You'll be an experienced Maths Teacher, able to carry maths through to Level 3 (A Level equivalent) work with differentiated learning and assess in a number of creative ways. You'll have a successful track record of designing and delivering inspiring lessons to teenagers, have a genuine love for teaching this age group and the ability to relate to and support them. With excellent subject knowledge, you'll be educated in your subject area to degree level, or be able to demonstrate a high level of competence through experience of teaching to this age group/level.

# **Job Description Maths Teacher**

**Responsible to:** The position is one of a team of specialist Subject Teachers working in the Upper School Faculty - a team of Teachers carrying responsibility for the Upper School. The Faculty work with the leadership and support of the Upper School Education Coordinator and Teaching Development Group. The position is accountable through the College to the Board of Trustees.

The primary focus of the post is to hold responsibility for weekly maths teaching in the School, within the context of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum.

#### Your duties will include:

- 1. To teach weekly Maths subject lessons in Upper School (age 14 to 18), which are appropriate to their age, and enables all pupils to recognise and achieve their potential.
  - (There may be opportunity for the right post-holder to take additional 2 to 4 week blocks of teaching during the year).
- 2. To deliver a developmentally appropriate Maths programme for Upper School that accords with the principles and methods of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum.

(We have teachers experienced and able to offer advice and support in working with the Steiner Waldorf curriculum, and can offer opportunities for mentoring and observation both at Cardiff and other Steiner schools, as well as external training and development).

- 3. To take overall responsibility for lessons taught including:
  - Maintaining good discipline and creating a harmonious learning environment where pupils feel safe, happy and can learn effectively;
  - Ensuring good work and study habits are developed;
  - Using effective assessment and recording systems to identify pupils' progress and use this to support all teaching and planning, in accordance with the requirements of the School and the Certificate of Steiner Education (NZCSE);
  - Ensuring the curriculum is appropriate and inclusive for all pupils, with effective differentiation and support that it is adequately monitored and evidenced;
  - Understanding teachers' responsibilities to pupils with ALN and taking ownership of their provision and progress within your subject, through inclusive and reflective practice
  - Keeping appropriate records, plans and pupil files, in accordance with statutory and School requirements;
  - Preparing and planning your teaching to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum in accordance with statutory and School requirements;
  - Planning the delivery of the Upper School curriculum so that appropriate evidence can be collected and marked, and the requirements of the NZCSE be fully met;
  - Keeping appropriate records, plans, pupil files and reports, in accordance with statutory and School requirements;
  - Liaising with parents on students' progress as required e.g. Parents Evenings;
  - Ensuring that appropriate study materials are available in good time and that homework, when given, is marked and timely feedback provided;
  - Managing any subject specific learning environment to a high standard of safety, cleanliness and aesthetics;

- Organising/developing materials and resources for lesson use and liaising with those responsible for purchase, keeping within an agreed budget;
- Liasing with other agencies and professionals where necessary, and working effectively with support staff, Faculty, College, School Management Team and the Administration.
- 4. To bring (or develop) an understanding of the Steiner curriculum, teaching method and the pedagogical principles that underpin them, and to renew this understanding through further study, on-going reflection and discussion of classroom practice;
- 5. Liaising with the Upper School Education Coordinator and other Teachers and colleagues to develop a coordinated approach to curriculum and individualised learning. This could include supporting Lower School teachers in their delivery of lessons within your subject expertise;
- 6. To review and reflect on your own teaching practice and take part in the appraisal of your own work performance including , including observation and mentoring as required;
- 7. To attend Teachers' meetings and other meetings as required;
- 8. To support the school's ethos, principles and objectives and contribute to whole-school activities and development;
- 9. Participating in the admissions process for new pupils including Open Days/events as required
- 10. To undertake appropriate preparation, study and training as necessary both for the effective delivery of the curriculum and to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives. This may include participating in work, study and INSET days during school holidays or weekends, as required;
- 11. To develop an understanding of, and work within, the School's compliance and legal obligations, including The Independent School Standards Wales, and Welsh Government and ALN legislation and guidance;
- 12. To be aware of and operate within the School's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including Child Protection and Health and Safety policies;
- 13. To participate in providing shared supervision for break time and cover for absent colleagues as required within contracted hours;
- 14. To uphold the School's commitment to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of children and young people;
- 15. To be a good advocate of Cardiff Steiner School at all times in your professional capacity as a member of staff;
- 16. Any other duties reasonably requested by the school. The job description is current but liable to variation to reflect or anticipate changes in the requirements of the post.

- Educated in the relevant teaching subject ideally to degree level, or be able to demonstrate a high level of competence through experience of teaching to this age group/level
- A committed individual with a real interest in Steiner-Waldorf education who supports the School's ethos and approach to education
- The skills and passion to work creatively with students to support their educational and personal development
- A genuine love for teaching and working with adolescents, and an ability to relate to and inspire them
- Excellent planning and assessment skills (in order to support pupils to achieve their potential, and to facilitate them meeting assessment standards in the Certificate of Steiner Education)
- An ability to maintain good discipline and behaviour with a consistent, firm but caring approach
- An ability to communicate and cooperate well with colleagues and parents
- An ability to work in a small, close knit team, and willingness to work with colleagues in the continued development of the School and the curriculum
- Self-motivation and an appreciation and enjoyment of rising to the challenges of developing a young school
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- A flexible, positive approach to work and the ability to work under pressure
- A sense of humour
- A track record of being punctual and reliable
- Suitability to work with children and a satisfactory enhanced Disclosure Barring Service check.
