End of Year Reports

Our End of Year Reports for all Class pupils and Kindergarten children aged 5 and over will be delivered to you online this year via **BigSIS**, our new school database system. You will receive an email invitation over the next 10 days asking you to sign-up and log in to the new **BigSIS Parent Portal** where you will be able to access your child's report as a PDF. September Return

Finally we'd like to update you on the latest Welsh Government announcement for schools in Wales. Yesterday Welsh Education Minister, Kirsty Williams, announced that all state schools in Wales would be able to open in September for ALL pupils where schools can accommodate them. Pupils will need only limited social distancing with pupils in their class or 'contact group', while adults will have to socially distance with each other. Updated operational guidance for September will be published by Welsh Government next week. Other key points from the announcement are:

- Schools will return to full capacity, with only limited social distancing within contact groups.
- At full operations, a contact group should consist of around 30 children. Some direct or indirect mixing between children in different contact groups will also be unavoidable, such as on transport, receiving specialist teaching or due to staffing constraints.
- Social distancing for adults should remain in line with regulations and guidance.
- Schools will be required to minimise the risk of transmission by taking other mitigating measures using the hierarchy of risk controls.
- Every school should continue to be "Covid Protected" having carried out risk assessments and mitigated them with a combination of controls such as hand and surface hygiene, one-way systems and so forth.
- If early warning information shows a local incident or outbreak then nearby schools should implement appropriate restriction measures.
- Each school will be provided with a supply of home testing kits.

Our School Management Team and College will be working throughout the summer on comprehensive planning for this, with a view to as full as reopening as is safely possible. Our usual **end of Year Parent Survey** will also be asking for parents' feedback to inform this, and we look forward to hearing from you.

Wishing all our pupils, families and staff a wonderful summer.
