	<p>Brigid has spent many years working in a variety of communication, public affairs and policy roles, with a special interest in health, wellbeing and education. She is also a qualified journalist, and has worked as a researcher, producer and reporter across various departments in the BBC. Brigid is the founder and driving force of Compassionate Mental Health - advocating for compassionate, recovery-focused approaches to mental health and curating experiential events to inform, inspire and empower people living and working with mental distress. Brigid's son Joseff attended Kindergarten until he was 6. Like many other former parents, Brigid has stayed connected to the community to help build a school so more children in Cardiff can benefit from a Steiner Waldorf education.</p>

Kate is a university lecturer at Cardiff Metropolitan University in the Cardiff School of Education and Social Policy, and has published on equality and diversity, inclusive pedagogy and Steiner education.
