Cardiff Steiner School are looking for a part-time Spanish teacher to bring an imaginative and enlivened experience of Spanish language and culture to our children aged 6 to 11.

For the first three years pupils are taught orally only, in ways that immerse the children in language and make language learning fun. Lessons are filled with age-appropriate, seasonal poetry, songs, tongue twisters and verses, often involving actions and finger games. As they progress children learn and act-out dramatised stories and short plays, and begin to take a more active part orally. This builds a foundation of experiences for reading and writing from the end of Class 3 (Year 4).

Job Description Spanish Teacher

Responsible to: The Spanish Teacher is one of a team of specialist Subject Teachers working in the Lower School Faculty - a team of Teachers carrying responsibility for the Lower School - and with the Upper School Spanish Teacher. The Faculty work with the leadership and support of the Lower School Education Coordinator and Teaching Development Group. The position is accountable through the College to the Board of Trustees.

The role: The primary focus of the post is to hold responsibility for Spanish language teaching and activity from age 6 to 11 within the school, and to bring a strong and enlivened Spanish language experience to pupils within the context of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum.

Your duties will include:

- 1. To teach Spanish to our children aged between 6 and 11 years, which is appropriate to their age, and enables all pupils to recognise and achieve their potential.
- 2. To use the Steiner Waldorf Language curriculum to devise and deliver a developmentally appropriate Spanish language programme that accords to the principles and methods of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum for this age group.
- 3. To take overall responsibility for each class during Spanish lessons including:
 - Maintaining good discipline and creating a harmonious learning environment where pupils feel safe, happy and can learn effectively;
 - Ensuring good work and study habits are developed;
 - Using effective assessment and recording to identify pupils' progress and use this to support all teaching and planning, in accordance with School requirements;
 - Ensuring the curriculum is appropriate and inclusive for all pupils, with effective differentiation and support that it is adequately monitored and evidenced;
 - Understanding teachers' responsibilities to pupils with ALN and taking ownership of their provision and progress within your subject, through inclusive and reflective practice;
 - Preparing and planning your teaching to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum in accordance with statutory and school requirements;
 - Keeping appropriate records, plans and pupil files, in accordance with statutory and School requirements;
 - Liaising with parents where required e.g. Parents Evenings;
 - Ensuring that appropriate study materials are available in good time and that work is marked and timely feedback provided;
 - Managing any subject specific learning environment to a high standard of safety ,order, cleanliness and aesthetics;
 - Organising/developing materials and resources for subject use and liaising with those responsible for purchase, keeping within an agreed budget;
 - Liasing with other agencies and professionals where necessary, and working effectively with support staff, Faculty, College, School Management Team and the Administration.
- 4. To bring (or develop) an understanding of the Steiner curriculum, teaching method and the pedagogical principles that underpin them, and to renew this understanding through further study, on-going reflection and discussion of classroom practice.
- 5. Liaising with the Class Teachers, Subject Teachers and other colleagues to develop a coordinated approach to curriculum and individualised learning;
- 6. To review and reflect on your own teaching practice and take part in the appraisal of your own work performance including , including observation and mentoring as required;
- 7. To attend Teachers' meetings and other meetings as required;

- 8. To support the school's ethos, principles and objectives and contribute to whole-school activities and development;
- 9. Participating in the admissions process for new pupils including Open Days/events as required
- 10. To undertake appropriate preparation, study and training as necessary both for the effective delivery of the curriculum and to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives. This may include participating in work, study and INSET days during school holidays or weekends, as required;
- 11. To develop an understanding of, and work within, the School's compliance and legal obligations, including The Independent School Standards Wales, and Welsh Government and ALN legislation and guidance;
- 12. To be aware of and operate within the School's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including Child Protection and Health and Safety policies;
- 13. To participate in providing shared supervision for break time and cover for absent colleagues as required within contracted hours
- 14. To uphold the School's commitment to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of children and young people;
- 15. To be a good advocate of Cardiff Steiner School at all times in your professional capacity as a member of staff;
- 16. Any other duties reasonably requested by the School. The job description is current but liable to variation to reflect or anticipate changes in the requirements of the post.

- An ability to bring an immersive Spanish language experience, including though song, drama, games and creative activities
- A committed individual with an interest in Steiner-Waldorf education
- A joy and enthusiasm for working with children, and an ability to relate to and inspire them
- An ability to maintain good discipline and behaviour with a consistent, firm but caring approach, and in interest in working with Restorative Approaches in creating and maintaining a positive learning environment
- An ability to plan and assess skills in order to support individual student's progress
- Good written and verbal communication skills
- Competent IT skills with the ability to use common word processing/spreadsheet applications, and the aptitude to use the School's various online data systems
- An ability to communicate and cooperate well with colleagues and parents

- An ability to work in a small, close knit team, and willingness to work with colleagues in the continued development of the School and curriculum
- A positive and flexible approach and the ability to work under pressure
- Excellent organisational skills, self-motivation and a strong sense of responsibility
- A track record of being punctual and reliable
