

# We're looking for a Part-time Spanish Teacher (secondary age) to start Jan 2023



Cardiff Steiner School are looking for a part-time Spanish teacher to bring a creative and enlivened experience of Spanish language and culture to our students aged 14 to 19.

You'll be teaching our small classes of 10-16 students, including students who have opted to take Spanish for our Upper School qualifications (GCSE to A-Level equivalent).

The position currently teaches 4 lessons per week on Wednesday 9.00 to 1.00pm, plus planning, prep, meeting and professional development time. We have an approx 36 week teaching year. The lesson timings may change each year according to the timetable.

# Job Description Spanish Teacher

**Responsible to:** The Spanish Teacher is one of a team of specialist Subject Teachers working in the Upper School Faculty - a team of Teachers carrying responsibility for the Upper School - and with the Lower School Spanish Teacher. The Faculty work with the leadership and support of the Upper School Education Coordinator and Teaching Development Group. The position is accountable through the College to the Board of Trustees.

**The role:** The primary focus of the post is to hold responsibility for Spanish language teaching and activity in Upper School, and to bring a creative and enlivened Spanish language experience to pupils within the context of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum.

#### Your duties will include:

1. To teach Spanish subject lessons to students in Upper School (age 14 to 18) which is appropriate to their age, and enables all students to recognise and achieve their potential.

2. To develop and deliver a developmentally appropriate Spanish language Upper School programme that is consistent with the principles and methods of the Steiner Waldorf curriculum and pedagogy; and which delivers the Certificate of Steiner Education (NZCSE) to Classes 10/11 through to class 12/13.

3. To bring or develop a secure understanding of the Steiner curriculum, teaching method and the pedagogical principles that underpin them, and to renew and further this through study, on-going reflection and discussion of classroom practice.

4. To take overall responsibility for each class during Spanish lessons including:

- Maintaining good discipline and creating a harmonious learning environment where pupils feel safe, happy and can learn effectively
- Ensuring good work and study habits are developed
- Using effective assessment and recording to identify pupils' progress and learning needs, and use this to support all teaching and planning, in accordance with School requirements and the requirements of the Certificate of Steiner Education (NZCSE)
- Ensuring the curriculum is appropriate and inclusive for all pupils, with effective differentiation and support that it is adequately monitored and evidenced
- Understanding teachers' responsibilities to pupils with ALN and taking ownership of their provision and progress within your subject, through inclusive and reflective practice
- Preparing and planning your teaching to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum in accordance with statutory and School requirements
- Planning the delivery of the Upper School curriculum so that appropriate evidence can be collected and marked, and the requirements of the NZCSE be fully met
- Keeping appropriate records, plans and pupil files, in accordance with statutory and School requirements
- Liaising with parents on students' progress and as required e.g. Parents Evenings
- Ensuring that appropriate study materials are available in good time and that homework, when given, is marked and timely feedback provided
- Managing any subject specific learning environment to a high standard of safety, cleanliness and aesthetics
- Organising/developing materials and resources for subject use and liaising with those responsible for purchase, keeping within an agreed budget

- 5. Organising and supervising pupil participation in relevant trips, festivals and other activities as required this may include developing connections with a school in a Spanish speaking country with a view to establishing pen friend exchanges and possible field trips
- 6. Liaising with the Education Coordinators, Class Teachers, Subject Teachers and other colleagues to develop a coordinated approach to curriculum and individualised learning
- 7. Liaising with other agencies and professionals where necessary
- 8. Working effectively with teaching and support staff, School Management Team and the Administrative Team
- 9. To attend Teachers' meetings and other meetings as required
- 10. To review and reflect on your own teaching practice and take part in the School's Teaching Development Programme (observation, mentoring etc.) and take part in the appraisal of your own work performance and assist in the appraisal of colleagues
- 11. To undertake appropriate preparation, study and training as necessary both for the effective delivery of the curriculum and to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives; including participating in planned work, study INSET and staff development days, which may be during school holidays or weekends as required
- 12. To support the school's ethos, principles and objectives and contribute to whole-school activities and school development as required
- 13. Participating in the admissions process for new pupils including Open Days/events as required
- 14. To develop an understanding of, and work within, the School's compliance and legal obligations, including The Independent School Standards Wales, and Welsh Government and ALN legislation and guidance, and the Steiner Waldorf Schools Fellowship
- 15. To be aware of and operate within the School's policies and procedures and to support their implementation including Child Protection, Equality and Diversity and Health and Safety policies
- 16. To participate in providing shared supervision for break time and cover for absent colleagues as required within contracted hours
- 17. To uphold the School's commitment to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of children and young people
- 18. To be a good advocate of Cardiff Steiner School at all times in your professional capacity as a member of staff
- 19. Any other duties reasonably requested by the School. The job description is current but liable to variation to reflect or anticipate changes in the requirements of the post

- A committed individual with an interest in Steiner-Waldorf education who supports the School's ethos and approach to education

- Planning and assessment skills, or the willingness to develop them with guidance, in order to support students to achieve their potential, and to facilitate them meeting assessment standards in the Certificate of Steiner Education
- An ability to maintain good discipline and behaviour with a consistent, firm but caring approach
- An interest in working with Restorative Approaches in creating and maintaining a positive learning environment
- Good written and verbal communication skills
- Competent IT skills with the ability to use common word processing/spreadsheet applications, and the aptitude to use the School's various online data systems
- An ability to communicate well with colleagues and parents
- An excellent team-worker able to work in a small, collaborative team, and keen to work with colleagues in the continued development of the School and the curriculum
- A positive and flexible approach to working in a new and pioneering context, and the ability to work under pressure
- Self-motivation and imagination
- A track record of being punctual and reliable
- Strong organisational skills and a strong sense of responsibility
